#### PEOPLE ON THE WAY

**Godric** (c. 1065-1170) was born in Norfolk. He became a merchant, trading between England, Scotland, Denmark and Flanders. After years at sea, he reportedly went to Lindisfarne, the holy island off the eastern coast of England near Durham, and this journey changed his life; he devoted himself to Christ. He made several pilgrimages to Rome and Jerusalem, and then in 1105 he sold all his goods and adopted the life of a hermit; he settled at Finchale on the banks of the River Wear for the last sixty years of his life. His counsel was sought by Thomas Becket and Pope Alexander III. Godric is the first known English lyric poet, and though he had no musical training, he became the earliest-known person to set English lyrics to music. His life and works were recorded by Reginald of Durham, and after his death in Finchale on May 21, 1170, two monks from Durham moved to his hermitage and founded a Benedictine priory.
