WORSHIP NOTES: We are singing the Psalter Lesson during the months of September and October in celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. Singing versified settings of the Psalms is a particular gift of our Reformed Tradition to the Protestant churches.

The Affirmation of Faith is from "Hymnal for Worship", an ecumenical worship book, published by the National Council of Churches in 1982 for use by hospital chaplains. This affirmation originated in the Protestant services at St. Elizabeth's Hospital in DC. We often use this affirmation at our services at Vantage House.
