PEOPLE ON THE WAY

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, theologian (February 4, 1906 – April 9, 1945) As World War 2 approached, this noted German theologian was studying in the United States. He returned to his homeland. When Hitler came to power and took over control of the church, he publically opposed him. He was one of the leaders of the Confessing Church movement and in time he became involved with the resistance movement. This led him to abandon his nonviolent stance and participate in a failed attempt to assassinate Hitler. For this he was arrested and sent to Buchenwald, and then to Flossenburg. On April 9, 1945 morning, while conducting worship, the guard came for him. He calmly said goodbye and walked courageously to his death by hanging. US soldiers reached the camp and liberated it two weeks later. His best known books include Life Together, emerging from his experience in founding a clandestine Protestant seminary, The Cost of Discipleship, coining the phrase "cheap grace", and Letters and Papers from Prison, birthing the idea of "religionless Christianity." Glory to God includes a hymn (818) by Bonhoeffer.

THE ECUMENICAL PRAYER CYCLE focuses the prayers of Christians week by week, so that over the year all the countries of the world are prayed for. This week we pray for *Bulgaria*, *Hungary*, *Romania*. *Pray for:*

- Those who welcome newcomers and provide for them and others in need;
- Respect for the rights of children, women, the young and the elderly, so they can receive adequate education, jobs and health care;
- Ending practices that harm the air, soil and forests, and installing instead measures to protect the environment.


