Shelf-Stable Needed Items for HCC Food Pantry Spring 2025

*Urgent: Cereal, Snacks, Spices and Condiments

Vegetables (no-sodium or low-sodium): Canned vegetables, Tomato products (paste, sauce) Mushrooms, Olives

Grains: Spaghetti, whole wheat spaghetti, Cereal with under 11g of added sugar (whole grain as first ingredient preferred)

Proteins: Low sodium beans, Dried lentils and soup mixes

Mixed Dishes: Ready made meals; Lower sodium soups (cream of mushroom, soups for baking), Pasta sauce (low sodium)

Beverages: Shelf-stable dairy alternatives, Tea, Coffee


BLACK HISTORY MONTH SPOTLIGHT Percy Lavon Julian

Percy Lavon Julian, Ph.D. (1899-1975) was a research chemist and entrepreneur. He was the first to synthesize the drug physostigmine, which is used in the treatment of glaucoma. He also developed a method for efficiently extracting sterol, a precursor of steroids hormones such as cortisone, from soybeans. His process lowered the cost of production of these compounds, ultimately enabling access of millions of people suffering from inflammatory conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis to this important steroid therapy. Julian was born in Montgomery, Alabama and attended school through eighth grade, the highest grade level available there for African American students. He was accepted at DePauw University in Indiana, as a "sub-freshman" with concurrent evening highschool courses for him to "catch up". He graduated Phi Beta Kappa and valedictorian of his class in 1920. Julian subsequently received his Master's degree from Harvard University and his Doctorate in chemistry from the University of Vienna. During his career he taught at Fisk University, Howard University and West Virginia State College. After completing his doctorate, Julian returned to DePauw where he continued his research on medicinal compounds in plants and, using findings from his graduate work on the Calabar bean, he accomplished the first chemical synthesis of physostigmine in 1935. Later, while working at the Glidden Company in Chicago as laboratory director, he discovered that sterol isolated from soybeans could be used as an inexpensive precursor for synthesis of steroid hormones. Julian was granted a number of patents for his discoveries during his career. He founded his own company, Julian Laboratories, in 1954. It became a successful business and helped foster the careers of the next generation of African American chemists. Some of Percy Julian's honors include: he was the first African American chemist elected to the National Academy of Sciences; his synthesis of physostigmine was recognized by the American Chemical Society as a National Historic Chemical Landmark; he received the Spingarn Medal from the NAACP.


