THE RIGHTEOUS MIND – A BOOK STUDY taught by Rev. Ken Page

Starting January 5, we will be engaging in a book study on *The Righteous Mind:* Why Good People Are Divided by Politics and Religion, by Jonathan Haidt. The New York Times has called this book "A landmark contribution to humanity's understanding of itself." Haidt brings his training and research as a Moral Psychologist to change conventional thinking about morality, politics, and religion in a way that speaks to everyone on the political spectrum. Join this class to gain insight about why progressives, conservatives, and libertarians have such different takes about right and wrong. Classes based on the book will be interspersed with classes about current events using our learnings. You will need to purchase the book. The other dates for the book study are February 2 & 9 and March 2 & 9 (a total of 6 weeks).

EXOPLANETS AND THE POSSIBILITY OF THEM SUPPORTING LIFE

Emma is Ken Page's daughter and is a PhD student in Astro Physics. Her research uses machine learning to identify exoplanets (planets outside of our solar system). She has currently discovered about 30 planets and is on track to discover more. Emma will talk about her research, and hit some fun stuff like life on other planets and the spirituality of gazing into space.

Evening – Jesus and the Disinherited by Howard Thurman – with Andrea – Jan 8 – Feb 12, 7-8:30pm – Zoom

A study of Jesus as the One who walks with people in the pain of oppression and presents the example of a life of love as empowering and preeminent. Thurman developed his ideas over more than a decade and was an influence in the thinking of Martin Luther King, Jr., and others in the civil rights movement.
