PEOPLE ON THE WAY

Patrick, died 461. Born of Christian parents in Britain, Patrick was kidnapped by Irish pirates at age sixteen, taken to Ireland and sold into slavery. After six years he escaped and returned to his family in southwest Britain. Soon he had a dream in which he was told to return to Ireland. He did, but after twenty-one years of training in France. He became a successful Christian missionary bishop. We have his own accounts of his confrontations with hostile authorities in power as he founded churches, monasteries and schools. On March 17, Patrick is celebrated as the one who, in twenty-nine years, made Ireland Christian. He has been described as the perfect blend of prayer and action. His baptismal hymn to the Trinity, also called *St. Patrick's Breastplate*, continues to be sung and prayed today. Our Closing Responses for Lent are based on this prayer.

We also remember: March 20, 1852 – Harriet Beecher Stowe's novel, *Uncle Tom's Cabin*, or *Life Among the Lowly* is published and becomes the best-selling book of the 19th century. The book brought to unprecedented light the plight of slaves, especially to people living in the north, and many historians believe the book helped to incite the Civil War.

THE ECUMENICAL PRAYER CYCLE focuses the prayers of Christians week by week, so that over the year all the countries of the world are prayed for. This week we pray for Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania. *Pray for:*

- Peaceful relations with Russia and among all the ethnic groups in these lands;
- Preservation of the distinct cultural practices, literature, music and natural resources in these countries;
- Just economic development that benefits all citizens in these countries, and for those who live and work abroad.






Lenten Devotional for Adults
