### PEOPLE ON THE WAY

Benjamin Britten (November 22, 1913 – December 4, 1976) was an English composer, conductor and pianist. He was a central figure of 20th-century British classical music, with a range of works including opera, other vocal music, orchestral and chamber pieces. He grew up in Suffolk, and went on to study music at the Royal College of Music in London. He was a prolific composer of operas, chamber music, song cycles, and choral and orchestral works. His father was an avowed atheist, and many have thought that Britten himself was an agnostic. Yet in the 1960s he described himself as a dedicated Christian, influenced by the writings of Paul Tillich and Bishop John AT Robinson's book *Honest to God*. Much of his work was on Christian themes. In Advent we remember him for his *Ceremony of Carols*, completed in 1942 on a ship sailing from New York to London. He is buried in Suffolk, in the churchyard of Aldeburgh Parish Church. The authorities at Westminster Abbey had offered burial there, but Britten made it clear that he wished to be buried next to his life partner, renowned tenor Peter Pears.

#### We also remember:

December 1 is World AIDS Day.

December 1, 1955 Rosa Parks was arrested in Montgomery, Alabama for refusing to give up her seat and move to the back of a city bus. This event sparked the 382-day Montgomery Bus Boycott, which sparked the modern movement for racial equality in the USA.

**THE ECUMENICAL PRAYER CYCLE** focuses the prayers of Christians week by week, so that over the year all the countries of the world are prayed for. This week we pray for *Myanmar, Thailand. Pray for:* 

- Minority ethnic and religious groups who continue to experience discrimination, persecution or even genocide (such as the Rohingyas), and for greater interfaith understanding and tolerance for ethnic and religious diversity;
- Those victimized by sex tourism and exploitation, and those who perpetuate such acts;
- Environmental protection as these countries undergo development.

### THE MYSTICAL PATH TO ADVENT IN PLAIN SIGHT

Sundays, (no class November 27), December 4, 11 & 18 at 9:30 a.m. facilitated by Bruce

Advent is coming soon! It is a time of preparation for the birth of Jesus, and also his second coming in our lives. Christian mysticism and its practices are also a way for us to prepare for God to appear in the now. This class will look briefly at Christian mysticism as expressed by Paul, as it was first developed and practiced by early Christian saints in eastern and western monasteries, and how it is practiced today. You'll also have the opportunity to briefly practice meditation in class.

We will also be using the book, <u>Advent in Plain Sight</u>, by Pastor Jill Duffield, the author of <u>Lent in Plain Sight</u> which we used for a Lenten class last Winter. We will join Pastor Duffield as she helps us find the deeper meanings of Advent and the coming of Jesus through Bible readings, reflections, and questions about everyday objects in our lives such as gates, light, trees and stars.

### **CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PAGEANT 2022**

Children age 2 through 5<sup>th</sup> grade are invited to participate in this year's Christmas Pageant, "The Good News Broadcast," on Sunday, December 18<sup>th</sup> during the 10:30 a.m. Worship Service. Pageant preparation takes place during Ark & L.I.F.E. Sunday School classes at 9:30 a.m. on November 13<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> and December 4<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup>. - Costumes will be provided for the Wise Kings, Mary, & Joseph. They should wear plain white, cream, tan, or black clothing to go underneath.
- The Ark Children will be stable animals sheep, donkeys, camels, etc. Costumes are available but families are welcome to use their own animal costumes if they prefer. If using one of the church's costumes, children should wear white, cream, tan, or black clothing the day of the Pageant as pant legs and sleeves will be visible.

Fairly traded Equal Exchange coffee, chocolate, and olive oil will be sold and the Presbyterian Women will be hosting a bake sale. Whether AGF has been your family tradition, you are looking for a way to make your holidays less commercial, or you are now ready to come back inside the church building please join us at the Alternative Gift Fair. (If you prefer online shopping for fair trade items from SERRV, see the link below.) And invite your friends and neighbors!

**Alternative Gifts**: Gift cards and descriptive inserts for a variety of local, national, and international charities will be available. When you donate, you pick up a card to send to the recipient and the AGF team takes care of passing the donations on to the organizations.

The **Children's Corner** is a separate section of the AGF where young shoppers (college age and younger) can pick out and wrap gifts for loved ones without adults seeing what they purchased! For younger children, an adult simply makes a list of the family, friends, teachers and others that the child will be shopping for, set a total budget (items will cost between \$1 and \$12), and then let the child do the rest. Shopping assistants are available to help children who need assistance, so even very young children can participate. All Children's Corner gifts are high-quality fair trade items from around the world — you won't be disappointed! Fair Trade Shopping: In our first year back in-person, our selection of fair trade items is smaller than in previous years because SERRV is no longer offering a consignment program. However, we do have a selection of gift items including a large order of SERRV's soup mixes, tea, seasoning blends and other food items. If you want to shop in advance for wider selection of gifts (or if you don't find what you wanted at AGF), you can shop directly on SERRV's website. Be sure to use the link because we earn 20% from your purchases, which raises funds for the church's Guatemala Project. You will shop and check out like a regular website, and items will be shipped directly to your door. You can use the SERRV link anytime between now and December 13.
